On 12 January 2022, you emailed the Ministry of Social Development (the Ministry) requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following information:

 Please advise the percentage of the available workforce that has not received an unemployment benefit at any time in the past five years. Or if it is easier the percentage of the available workforce that have received this benefit.

Jobseeker Support is a temporary benefit paid for up to 52 weeks while clients look for work, are in training for work or unable to work due to a health condition, injury or disability. The Ministry publishes Benefit Fact Sheets each quarter, which provides a high-level view of trends in benefit receipt, including Jobseeker Support. As part of this, the Ministry has provided information on the percentage of the working age population receiving Jobseeker Support over the last six years.
