Dear A J Shepard

I refer to your email of 13 July 2022 to the Office of the Prime Minister requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA), the following:

4. I request the fuel usage for the rnzaf boeing 737 that the prime minister treats as her personal taxi. Please provide fuel usage in a yearly breakdown format from 2017 through to present day.

Question 4 from your request was transferred to the New Zealand Defence Force (NZDF) for response in accordance with section 14(b)(ii) of the OIA.

The Royal New Zealand Air Force (RNZAF) does not have any Boeing 737s, the RNZAF generally uses its Boeing 757s for VIP transport. The following table lists the RNZAF Boeing 757 flights from 2017 that included the Prime Minister as a passenger along with Government ministers, officials, and others as required. The total fuel burn is provided per flight. There were no RNZAF Boeing 757 flights taken by the Prime Minister between July 2019 and September 2020.
