- Displaying expired evidence of vehicle inspection (WOF)
- Not displaying evidence of vehicle inspection (WOF)

Land Transport Act 1998

Section 34(1)(b) Contravention of section 6

- (1) A person commits an offence if the person -
(b) operates a vehicle on a road without displaying current evidence of vehicle inspection or a certificate of loading or both (as may be required by the regulations or the rules);

Section 6. Vehicles to be safe and operated in compliance with rules---

- (1) A person may not operate an unsafe motor vehicle on a road.
(2) If the regulations or the rules require a vehicle to have current evidence of vehicle inspection or a current certificate of loading, or both, a person may not operate the vehicle on a road without the appropriate current evidence of vehicle inspection or certificate or both (as the case may require).
(3) A person operating a motor vehicle that is required to have current evidence of vehicle inspection or a certificate of loading must comply with the provisions in the regulations and the rules concerning such evidence or certificate, and the operation of the vehicle.
(4) Evidence of vehicle inspection must be displayed on the vehicle to which it applies

P411	Current licence label not affixed in prescribed manner – parked vehicle
(Infringement = \$200) Land Transport (Motor Vehicle Registration & Licensing) Regulations 2011, regulation 77(2)(b)(ii)	
NOP Operated a motor vehicle on a road when the current licence issued to the vehicle and appropriate for its use was not affixed to it in the manner prescribed by the Land Transport (Motor Vehicle Registration & Licensing) Regulations 2011	

Enforcement Guideline

Infringement applies to any vehicle (excluding trade licences):

- Displaying an expired licence label
- A vehicle not displaying a current licence label but MVR indicates it is current. This applies if vehicle has received a previous warning for this offence.
- Not displaying a licence label
