The Department has been monitoring passport demand during the national and international response to COVID-19 and the Omicron variant. The effect of recent border announcements has led to pre-COVID-19 level demand for passports.

Due to COVID-19, we are experiencing staff absences of well over 30% in key service delivery areas. As a result, we are failing to meet expected service levels. Passport issuance now exceeds 18 days (the target being 10 days), birth certificates 16 days (the target being eight days), and average contact centre wait time exceeding 50 minutes. with 60% of callers abandoning before we answer.

On 9 March 2022, we activated our Business Continuity Plan. This means we will be shifting resources to the highest priority work and putting other work on hold. The work highest priorities are; birth and death registrations, passports, citizenship by descent and administration of RealMe. We will call on experienced staff from non-priority areas to return to frontline mahi.

This will impact on Te Ara Manaaki, Charities, Community Operations and potentially other parts of Department. It also means we will significantly reduce our counter services to urgent appointments only (such as urgent passport collections).

Rapid Antigen Tests are available and being distributed to households with information sheets on how to manage COVID-19 should individuals test positive. Chatham Islands Council and CDHB are working on plans for evacuating critical patients to hospitals in New Zealand.
