



Corrections Officer

<p>Issued to corrections officers</p>	<p>The following PPE is standard for Corrections Officers in their day to day duties.</p>
<p>Stab Resistant Body Armour</p>	
<p>Body Worn Camera (BWC) is issued to all officers rostered on shift.</p>	
<p>Individual Carry Pepper Spray (ICP) contained in a holster attached to the officers belt (is not issued to all officers on a daily basis.) ICP is issued to officers that are selected on a rostered shift.</p>	
<p>Mechanical restraints/ Chain link Handcuffs. Handcuffs are issued to officers that are selected on a rostered shift.</p>	
<p>Radio</p>	

<p>Radio Earpiece for safety and security allowing staff to receive and send information without others in the immediate vicinity hearing.</p>	
<p>Search gloves Hypodermic needle- and cut-resistant palm and fingertips</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Slash-resistant knit on back of hand • Grip pads to assist in searches

Officers supplied with PPE for their response to an incident or planned event within a prison

Mk9 or Cellbuster pepper spray (if authorised to use for a planned use of force).



Gas Mask and Canister is used by the Control and restraint team if Cell buster pepper spray is authorised and used.



Advanced Control and Restraint Teams (ACR)

ACR team members are trained to respond to some of the departments most violent incidents. They are provided with the following PPE

Fire retardant overalls



Boots with added toe protection



Balaclava fire Retardant



Gloves provides slash protection



Helmet

6ft Shield , used in open areas to provide greater protection. Used at the front of barricades, allows staff access the barricade allowing greater protection.



4ft Shield, widely used for our ACR teams as they are more mobile and ability to be agile in different circumstances



Commanders shield, used by section leaders



Grappling hook, to help in removing barricade material by an ACR section



Mechanical restraints/ Chain link Handcuffs
